- The Wonders Of Language Or How To Make Noises and Influence People, Ian Roberts (2017) one of the most accessible and well-written introductions to the study of linguistics (useful for learning linguistics terminology and beginning the study of linguistics by yourself).

Trask (1999) an accessible overview of language study and linguistics, both theoretical and practical (more of a general introduction to the questions raised in language study e.g. how language works in the brain, why languages change, child language acquisition, etc.)
